Alan Broad attended L'Anse Creuse beginning in kindergarten at Jefferson Elementary and graduated from L'Anse Creuse High School in 1964. Broad was president of his senior class, graduated from the University of Michigan and The Detroit College of Law (now Michigan State University College of Law). In 1974, Broad was elected to the L'Anse Creuse Board of Education where he served as a member and president until 1982.

In 1975 Broad was appointed to the position of Assistant Attorney General of Michigan where he served for 10 years as senior trial attorney. In 1985, he established The Grosse Pointe Law Firm, P.C. where he continues to practice civil litigation.

Broad is married to Cynthia Morgan Broad, an Ohio girl, who continues her 41 year professional career teaching special needs students at Higgins Elementary in L'Anse Creuse. Broad and Cynthia first met in 1970, after mutual friends introduced them and an argument ensued over that year's Michigan/Ohio state football game. Cynthia was recognized as Michigan's Teacher of the Year in 1989-90, and awarded the national Milken Foundation Outstanding Educator Award the same year. Broad and Cynthia have two sons, Trevor in New York City and Travis in Washington DC, both graduates of the University of Michigan.
